Hello everyone and HaPpY New Year! It's 2025! Can you believe it? I thought when I was a kid, that when it got to be the year 2025, we'd all be ancient and living like the Jetson's! I'm glad to know we are not, and our small town still feels like a Hallmark movie!

Although this Holiday season seems to be fleeting, I hope you all were able to have a very Merry Christmas that included all that you love! Our Country Christmas Parade and Tree Lighting Ceremony was bigger and lasted longer than years past! Thanks to all who participated and made this event more special.

I want to thank you all for my re-election as Mayor, it truly is an honor to serve this community. I would also like to congratulate and welcome our newly elected Councilor, Maite Taylor and re-elected Councilors, Michael Kohl, and Eddie Chittum. I also want to extend my many thanks to former Councilman Tim Leeth for his 8 years of service to the Town of Grottoes and our citizens. It has been wonderful to work along side Councilman Leeth and although he may have "left us for the band," he'll still be around, and he hasn't left town!

It is also my pleasure to announce and welcome our new Town Manager, Kyle O'Brien. His tenure began December 2, 2024, and he has hit the ground running! Kyle first started his career right here, back in 1997, and he says he is here to stay. We will be collaborating alongside one another to ensure that we are on track and thriving for years to come.

Over the course of this year, we plan to accomplish the many projects that have been on the books for some time now. Our Public Works Department and our partnering engineering firms will be installing, repairing, and upgrading our water lines and sewage treatment plant. The Town's "Welcome" signs at our entry points will be updated and constructed to mirror the one that is located at John E. Painter Park

in design. This new signage comes from a grant received from the County for beautification projects. We also plan to complete the First Responders Memorial at Town Hall this spring. Both projects will be constructed by R&L Construction and the town will hold a special event to commemorate the completion of the First Responders Memorial!

The final stages of completion to the Town's Comprehensive Plan with the aid of the Central Shenandoah Planning District Commission (CSPDC) are also underway.

Lastly, we closed December 2024 with several applicant submissions to serve on the Planning Commission. Council will begin reviewing applications and the interview process will begin within the coming weeks.

From the Chief's Desk...


We at the police department hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

As we enter the traditionally coldest months of the new year, please make sure your motor vehicle is ready for the cold temperatures. Important items to check are the battery, Antifreeze levels, heater and defrost, tires along with windshield wipers, and windshield washer fluid.

It is also a good idea to have an emergency kit in your vehicle if you must travel during inclement weather. FEMA recommends everyone carry at least a set of jumper cables, flares or reflective triangles, a cell phone, a cell phone charger, an ice scraper, a blanket, bottled water, and cat litter or sand for traction on snow or ice-covered surfaces.

If you must be out in the elements during cold temperatures remember to stay hydrated and dress in layers to stay warm.

If you use a space heater, or fuel heater such as kerosene or propane please follow these safety tips to avoid a fire or injury. Keep the heat source at least 3 feet from anything flammable. Don't leave it unattended. Keep out of reach of children and pets. If electric, plug directly into a wall outlet. Make sure to have a working smoke and carbon monoxide alarm. Check the device for malfunction. Don't use an outdoor heater indoors.
